The apostle John in his epistles (I John 2: 18, 4: 2-3, and II John 7), presented another name for the horseman of revelation: the antichrist.

Note¹: Greek antichristos (ἀντίχριστος) - in place of, the name will signify one who puts himself in the place of Christ: consequently, antichrist is a false Christ. But if the preposition denotes oppositions, antichrist is one who oppose Christ. (Matthew 24:5,24).

Another title for the first horseman in Revelation is "The beast." It comes from the Greek word ($\theta\eta\rho$ íov -"thērion"). It is mentioned 19 times in the New Testament. Interesting, one of the passages that mention this Greek word is in the book of Acts it is translated as "viper" or a venomous creature.

 "But when Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks and laid them on the fire, a viper ("thērion") came out because of the heat, and fastened on his hand. So when the natives saw the creature hanging from his hand." Acts 28: 3-4

The beast's last attempt

Satan's always knew his destiny. The Bible says that he is already judged and found guilty without redemption. It is Unknown to us when, however, God had prepared a place to send him and his demons called the Lake of Fire as their eternal prison. In Revelation chapter twelve and verse twelve says,

 "For the devil has come down to you, having great wrath, because he knows that he has a short time." Revelation 12: 12

Even after all the plagues, antichrist will still think that he is God and together with the false prophet and the devil they will gather an army of two hundred million soldiers for an apocalyptic battle quite mentioned in the Bible:

- "And the sixth angel poured out his bowl on the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up to prepare the way for the kings of the East. And I saw three unclean spirits that looked like frogs coming out of the mouths of the dragon, the beast, and the false prophet. These are demonic spirits that perform signs and go out to all the kings of the earth, to assemble them for battle on the great day of God, the Almighty." Revelation 16: 12-14
- "And they gathered them together to the place called in Hebrew, Armageddon." *Revelation* 16: 16
- "Now the number of the army of the horsemen was two hundred million; I heard the number of them. And thus, I saw the horses in the vision: those who sat on them had breastplates of fiery red, hyacinth blue, and sulfur yellow; and the heads of the horses were like the heads of lions; and out of their mouths came fire, smoke, and brimstone. Revelation 9: 16-17
 - a) Anti-christ main target

The beast will get his political, satanic, and military arsenal focus to fight against their major enemy and target: Jesus Christ:

- "The ten horns which you saw are ten kings who have received no kingdom as yet, but they receive authority for one hour as kings with the beast. These are of one mind, and they will give their power and authority to the beast. They will wage war against the Lamb...," Revelation 17: 12-14
- "And I saw the beast, the kings of the earth, and their armies, gathered together to make war against Him who sat on the horse and against His army." Revelation 19: 19
 - b) The first horseman will be defeated

As we read in the beginning of our study, in chapter six of Revelation, "He who sat on it had a bow; and a crown was given to him, and he went out conquering and to conquer." This wicked king, crowned to conquer and to set up his evil kingdom, which will capture and murder many of God's people, will lose his crown and, his kingdom. He will be arrested and send to his eternal destination with his followers:

 "Then the beast was captured, and with him the false prophet who worked signs in his presence, by which he deceived those who received the mark of the beast and those who worshiped his image. These two were cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone." Revelation 19: 20

"These will make war with the Lamb, and the Lamb will overcome them, for He is Lord of lords and King of kings; and those *who are* with Him *are* called, chosen, and faithful." Revelation 17: 14

c) The last horseman will triumph again

In our next study, we will learn about the last horseman of Revelation, but to close this article, we have to read about the glorious King over the beast and his kingdom:

• "Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war. ¹² His eyes were like a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except Himself. ¹³ He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God. ¹⁴ And the armies in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses. ¹⁵ Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. ¹⁶ And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS." Revelation 19: 11-16

The divine wrath will come upon the world:

• "For this you know, that no fornicator, unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. 6 Let no one deceive you with empty words,

for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience." Ephesian 5: 5-6

ii. This wrath will not come against God's people:

- "To wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, even Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come." I Thessalonians 1: 10
- "For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, "I Thessalonians 5: 9

However, do not forget

- "In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." John 16: 33
- "Strengthening the souls of the disciples, exhorting them to continue in the faith, and saying, "We must through many tribulations enter the kingdom of God."" Acts 14: 22
- "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." II Timothy 3: 12

Therefore, we have to distinguish the difference between tribulation and wrath.

Look the definition of the Greek words in Scriptures:

d) Wrath - ὀργὴν – orgēn

The church will be spared from the wrath of God:

- "and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath (orgēn). I Thes. 1: 6-10
- "For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath(orgēn)but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. 10 He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. 11 Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." I Thes. 5: 9-11

WHY THE CHURCH CAN'T FACE WRATH?

- "being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith, to demonstrate His righteousness, because in His forbearance God had passed over the sins that were previously committed, 26 to demonstrate at the present time His righteousness, that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus." Romans 3: 24-26
- 'In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins" I John 4: 10
- "and above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat. Of these things we cannot now speak in detail." Hebrews 9: 5

Propitiation that by which God is rendered propitious, i.e., by which it becomes consistent with his character and government to pardon and bless the sinner. The propitiation does not procure his love or make him loving; it only renders it consistent for him to execise his love towards sinners.

In Romans 3:25 and Hebrews 9:5 (A.V., "mercy-seat") the Greek word hilasterion is used. It is the word employed by the LXX. translators in Exodus 25:17 and elsewhere as the equivalent for the Hebrew kapporeth, which means "covering," and is used of the lid of the ark of the covenant (Exodus 25:21; 30:6). This Greek word (hilasterion) came to denote not only the mercy-seat or lid of the ark, but also propitation or reconciliation by blood. On the great day of atonement the high priest carried the blood of the sacrifice he offered for all the people within the veil and sprinkled with it the "mercy-seat," and so made propitiation.

In 1 John 2:2; 4:10, Christ is called the "propitiation for our sins." Here a different Greek word is used (hilasmos). Christ is "the propitiation," because by his becoming our substitute and assuming our obligations he expiated our guilt, covered it, by the vicarious punishment which he endured. (Compare Hebrews 2:17, where the expression "make reconciliation" of the A.V. is more correctly in the RSV "make propitiation.")

e) Trials - θλῖψιν - thlipsin

But, not from trials or tribulations,

- "Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, (thlipsin) and shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake." Matt. 24: 9
- "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: (thlipsin) but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." John 16: 22
